



## **Zimbabwe Tourism Covid-19 Guidelines as at 07 July 2021**

### **Travellers are subject to the following conditions:**

- a) On arrival, passengers are required to complete Health Questionnaires detailing where they have travelled to and providing personal details for COVID-19 tracking purposes.
- b) Upon arrival, all travellers are required to present a negative PCR COVID-19 Clearance Certificate issued by a recognized facility within 48 hours from the date of departure.
- c) Travellers with fake COVID-19 documents will attract custodial sentences.
- d) Travellers coming from high-risk areas of the COVID 19 Alpha and Delta variants shall be quarantined at their own expense with PCR tests conducted on Days 1, 3, 5 and 10.
- e) Those deported back to Zimbabwe will be subjected to self-quarantine or will be quarantined in identified places.
- f) Upon clearance to enter into Zimbabwe, tourists are expected to follow COVID-19 guidelines at hospitality and recreation facilities.
- g) Domestic tourists are not required to present COVID-19 Certificates but are expected to follow COVID-19 guidelines at hospitality and recreation facilities.
- h) A dedicated national toll-free '2023' helpline and call centre is available for information about COVID-19 to travellers.
- i) On departure tourists can obtain COVID-19 certificates from the approved laboratories.

### **The following restrictions remain in place to prevent the spread of Covid-19;**

- a) Wearing of masks, social distancing, and hands sanitizing must be observed all times when in public places.
- b) Restaurants may only serve customers on a takeaway basis and may not provide seating for waiting customers.
- c) Bars attached to hotels and lodges must close by 2200hrs.
- d) Business operating time is the period between 0800hrs and 1530hrs
- e) Curfew is between 1830hrs and 0600hrs.
- f) The international airports are open to all travellers but land borders remain closed for visitors except commercial traffic, diplomats and returning residents.

**NB: Please note that these Covid-19 guidelines are subject to change depending on the Statutory Instruments issued at a given time period.**
