

EU FAMILY MEMBERS

Who is eligible to apply:

1. Spouses, if not legally separated and not under 18 years of age;
2. Civil partners;
3. Children under 21 years of age (on application submission), including children of the spouse and children born out of wedlock, provided that, for children under 18 years of age, the other parent (if there is another parent), has given his/her consent;
4. Children older than 21 years old if they are unable to support their indispensable necessities of life because of their health conditions entailing total disability (this must be proven);
5. Financially dependent parents, whose socio-economic situation and/or serious health conditions and/or disability must be supported by adequate evidence.
 1. Duly completed application form [[Modello domanda visto D](#)];
 2. Passport-style photo full front and white background and not older than 6 months ([PHOTO](#));
 3. Passport or travel document (original plus one photocopy). The passport will be kept and returned with the visa, if approved;
 4. Cover letter;
 5. Proof of relationship:
 1. marriage/birth certificate (original plus one photocopy). Please, note: marriage/civil partnership certificates older than 6 months will NOT be accepted;
 2. certificates issued by a foreign authority other than Zimbabwe, must be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country;
 3. Italian nationals registered at the AIRE whose marriage certificate has been registered at the Embassy of Italy are exempt from providing an updated version of the above-mentioned certificate. They will be required to provide a self-declaration confirming to be married to the extra-UE citizen.
6. EU relative's passport (original plus one photocopy);
7. Declaration from the EU relative's stating the applicant is travelling – or joining – the EU family member.

EU family members joining their spouse in Italy for stays over 90 days need to apply for a National Visa submitting the documents listed above plus a declaration by their spouse confirming their intent to permanently move to Italy.

Once in Italy, they must register themselves with the local Anagrafe (Registry Office) and apply for a residence card at the relevant Questura within 8 days from their arrival.

The Embassy may request for additional documentation, at the time of application.
